Format and Time Commitment

We will have three face-to-face workshops (Fridays: Sept 9, Oct 7, Nov 4; Time: 9AM-12 noon) and use SharePoint or Blackboard to centralize information, share portfolios, and engage in weekly on-line discussion.

Greg Kniseley will facilitate the community. Since this is a collaborative, learning community, everyone will share experiences, expertise, and discoveries. It is designed for the novice or more expert user of Chalk and Wire. This is a colleague-to-colleague exploration of Chalk & Wire e-portfolios for instruction, assessment, and other purposes. This is NOT intended to be a technical workshop on Chalk & Wire. However, if questions arise, we will answer them together or seek knowledgeable others such as Ryan Hanley, Technical Support for FSEHD Chalk & Wire. .

Expectations and Rewards

Each member will receive \$400 if she or he:

- Participate in all scheduled face to face meetings and online discussion
- Respond to related readings during face to face meetings or online discussions
- Create and share with the learning community a shell of a Chalk and Wire portfolio with a rubric or other scoring system.
- Provide peer feedback and support.

Questions to Explore

- What are the benefits/limitations of an electronic portfolio?
- What is a course portfolio?
- What is a hiring (showcase) portfolio?
- What are the components of a portfolio?
- How can a portfolio be used?
- How do you assess a course or hiring portfolio using a rubric or other scoring system?
- How do you create assessments (rubrics) for evaluating course portfolios and link to standards or employers expectations?
- How can learners demonstrate knowledge, skills, and dispositions in a portfolio?
- How do you build a portfolio on Chalk & Wire? (e.g., Table of Contents, Rubrics, Assessments)
- What digital media skills are desired (e.g., scanning; working with digital images, video, and audio files; editing)?
- How do you share a portfolio with others (e.g., URL or downloading to a computer, USB drive, or CD)?
- How can a faculty member showcase his/her teaching, scholarship, and service for a “tenure and promotion” e-portfolio?
