METHOD

In the Spring 2011, an e-mail invitation was sent to full time (N=81) and currently teaching part-time faculty (N=149) to complete a [survey](#). The questions were designed to include demographic information (included in the faculty qualifications report), and additional information about collaborative projects. Full time faculty received two reminders, while part-time faculty received none. 118 responses were received, the response rate of 51%, with subset of Full time faculty responding at 99% rate. It is fair to represent the sample as consisting of all full time, and the most active part of the part time faculty.

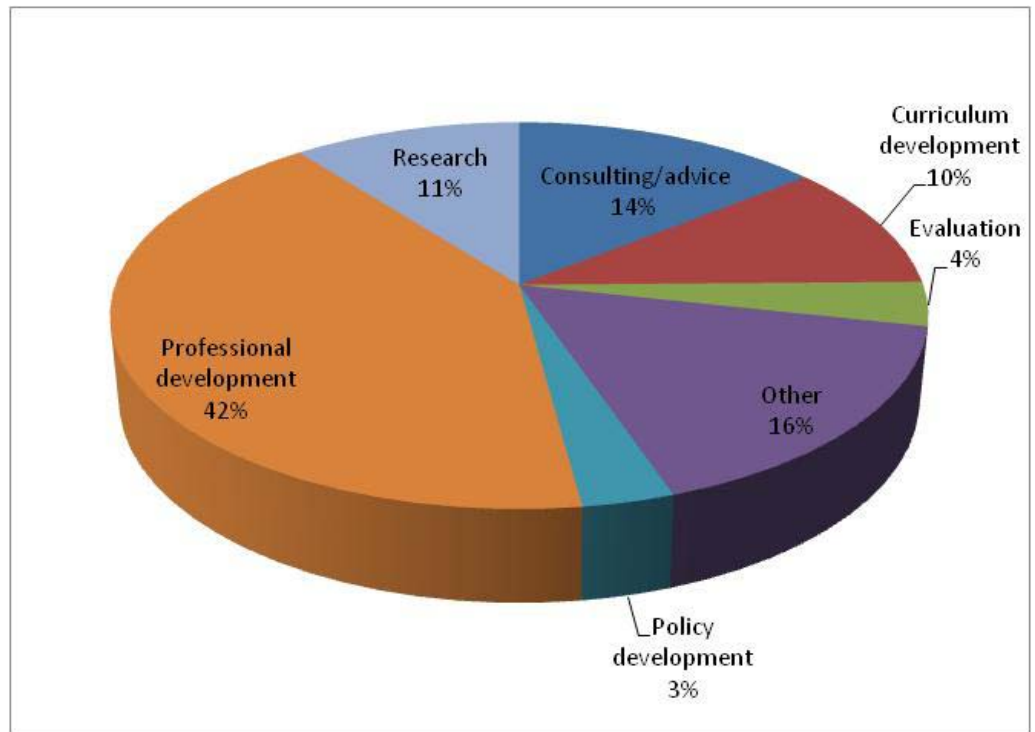
93 or 79% of individuals reported at least one collaborative activity involving K-12 educators within the last three years. The total length of collaborative projects is 141726 days, or 388 years, with the average of 720 days (two years).

FUNDING

119 projects were not funded; 58 were funded through grants.

IMPACT

A total of 28,804 of K-12 educators is estimated to be impacted by these projects, or 171.5 average.

ANALYSIS

The event included a living history component in the guise of a Civil War encampment that included hands on experiences ranging from period baseball, close order drill, musketry, and camp life as demonstrated by teh 14 RI Heavy Artillery. The Providence Brigade Band reproduced period music played on reconstructed and original instruments. Three scholarly events followed that included John Franklin from the Smithsonian Museum of African American History and Culture, a roundtable discussion featuring noted historians Frank Williams, Mark Dunkelman, and Maury Klein, and concluded with a presentation by Morgan Grefe from teh RI Historical Society. 150 students and teachers from North Providence HS, Segue Institute for Learning, and the Henry Barnard School participated in the Living History events. The HS students and teacher stayed through the keynote address. The event was advertised through PBS RI and the Providence Journal
