**Profile of Entering Freshmen
Fall 2010**

A Report on the CIRP Survey of Rhode Island College Fall 2010 Freshmen

Each year Rhode Island College, in conjunction with the American Council on Education's Cooperative Institutional Research Program (CIRP), surveys our entering freshmen to collect demographic data as well as information on the high school backgrounds, career plans, educational aspirations, financial support, and current attitudes of the newly enrolled Fall students. This report presents the results of the survey for this year's first-time, full-time freshmen, and for comparative purposes, freshmen students entering four-year public, low-selectivity colleges nationwide in September 2010. Institutions participating in the CIRP freshman survey are categorized by "selectivity level" as defined by the average SAT or ACT composite score for the Fall 2010 entering class. At four-year institutions, the dividing score between low selectivity and medium selectivity is a combined SAT score of 985, while the dividing score between medium selectivity and high selectivity is a combined score of 1035. One thousand six, or 92%, of the first time, full-time Rhode Island College freshmen completed the survey this year.

INTERESTING FINDINGS

- Fifty-six percent of the full-time freshmen stated Rhode Island College was their first choice.
- Sixty-five percent indicated cost of attendance was a "very important" factor in deciding to attend RIC and 52% stated academic reputation was "very important".
- Approximately 91% of the first time, full-time freshmen intend to complete at least a Bachelor's degree at the College. Sixty-six percent of the RIC freshmen intend to earn a Bachelor's degree and another 23% intend to continue on and complete their Master's degree. Another 2% plan on earning a Ph.D. at the College.
- Twenty-three percent indicated teaching as their probable career choice.
- Eighty-two percent reported their average grade in high school was a B or above.
- Ninety-two percent of the full-time freshmen reported they are confident about having sufficient funds or will most likely have the funds to finance their college education.
- Forty-six percent plan to live on campus during the fall semester.
- Sixty-nine percent intend to work ten or more hours per week while in school.
- Approximately 52% of Rhode Island College freshmen are first generation college students.

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

The majority of Rhode Island College's first time, full-time freshmen continue to be white, female students, commuting from nearby locales. Most have just graduated from high school and are from predominately middle class families of Roman Catholic background. Approximately 21% percent of the entering freshmen identify themselves as non-white, compared to 18% last year. The percentage of students identifying themselves as non-native English speaking is 9%, the same as last year.

AGE

- Eighty-four percent of these freshmen are 18 years of age or younger and 99% are 19 years of age or younger. Ninety-nine percent graduated from high school in the year prior to attending the College.

GENDER

- Sixty-eight percent of the respondents are female, 32% are male. In 2009, 67% of the respondents were female and 33% were male.

RACIAL BACKGROUND

- Seventy-nine percent of the freshmen are White/Caucasian. Self-identified minority group members with the greatest representation this year are Hispanic (15.2%) and African American/Black (7.2%). The remainder of the students identified themselves as Asian American/Asian (3.7%), American Indian/Alaska Native (2.0%), Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (0.9%), and "Other" (3.6%). *(Students were allowed to select multiple racial/ethnic groups)*

RESIDENCE

- Forty-six percent of the freshmen plan to live on campus as compared to 48% in 2009. Fifty-one percent plan to live at home with parents or relatives and this compares to 49% in 2009. Three percent expect to reside in other private, off-campus housing.

CITIZENSHIP STATUS

- Ninety-seven percent of this year's freshmen reported they are U.S. Citizens; three percent reported they are permanent residents.


FAMILY BACKGROUND

- The median family income reported for this year's freshmen is \$55,210 compared to \$58,545 reported last year. In contrast, the median family income reported for the national peer group this year is \$38,933 compared to \$46,513 reported for last year.
- RIC freshmen reported that 33% of their fathers and 35% of their mothers have a college degree. Another 16% of their fathers and 20% of their mothers have some college-level education.
- Ninety-two percent of the students' fathers and 83% of their mothers are employed. The most frequently reported occupations for fathers are business (19%), skilled worker (8%), and unskilled workers (6%). The most frequently cited occupations for mothers, consistent with last year's cohort, are business (13%), elementary/secondary education (11%), and nursing (10%).

HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC BACKGROUND

- The majority of freshmen reported an average high school grade of a B or B+, with women continuing to report higher averages than men. This year 86% percent of the women reported a high school average grade of a B or better, compared to 75% of the men.

- The percentage of Rhode Island College freshmen reporting a high school grade of “B or better” has remained relatively consistent at approximately 80% over the last five-year period, with the exception of a slight decline to 76% in 2007. The national sample has essentially mirrored this trend, having a decline in 2007 (69%), but rebounding by seven percentage points in 2008 in the number reporting a grade of “B or better”. The percentage of RIC students reporting an average high school grade of a “B+ or better” has increased slightly over the past five years while the percentages for those students in the national sample decreased in 2006, 2008, and 2010.



RATINGS OF ABILITIES



- Rhode Island College freshmen continue to rate themselves lower than the freshmen in the national sample in terms of abilities. This year RIC freshmen rated themselves “above average” or in the “highest 10%”, as compared to the average person of his or her age, in only two of the twenty-four abilities surveyed. RIC freshmen rated themselves higher on Writing Ability (38.5% vs. 37.6%) and on Cooperativeness (68.4% vs. 67.9%).
- The five abilities for which RIC freshmen rate themselves lower than their national counterparts and which reflect the greatest differences between RIC students and the national group are: Spirituality (25% vs. 36.9%), Intellectual Self-confidence (44.4% vs. 54.4%), Drive to achieve (62.7% vs. 72.3%), Social Self-confidence (42.8% vs. 52.1%) and Self-understanding (45.9% vs. 55.2%). The following table represents all 24 items for which the respondents were asked to rate their level of ability, going from RIC’s highest to lowest rated ability:

COLLEGE FINANCES

- Eight percent of Rhode Island College freshmen reported having a “major” concern with their ability to finance their education. As was true in past years, there is a difference when comparing gender. For those respondents attending the College, 4.5% of the men reported having a major concern with their ability to finance their education for the academic year while 9.5% of women reported being able to finance their education was a “major” concern. There is also a difference between genders in the national sample. Approximately one-third more female students (18% vs. 12%) reported having a major concern with their ability to finance their education than male students did. The Rhode Island College freshmen who reported “some” concern with their ability to finance their education increased slightly, from 57% in 2009 to 58% in 2010. At 59%, those students in the national group who reported having “some” concern with their ability to finance their education also increased slightly when compared to last year.
- The survey also asked students to indicate how much of their first year’s educational expenses (room, board, tuition, and fees) they expected to cover from various sources. Five questions in the survey addressed various resources; “Family resources (parents, relatives, spouse, etc.)”, “My own resources (savings from work, work-study, other income)”, “Aid which need not be repaid (grants, scholarships, military funding, etc.)”, “Aid which must be repaid (loans, etc.)”, and “Other than above”. The following chart shows the percentage of students who anticipated meeting at least \$1,000 of their expenses from these resources, while the second chart shows the percentage of students who expected to meet at least some of their educational expenses from these resources.



- Fifty percent of RIC freshmen compared to 46% of the freshmen in the national group anticipated meeting at least \$1,000 of their first year’s educational expenses from “family resources”. RIC freshmen (36%) are reporting slightly higher than the national respondents (28%) in using their “own” resources to cover expenses. Forty-six percent of Rhode Island College freshmen reported using “aid which must be repaid” compared to 39% reported by the national group. In the remaining two resources listed, RIC freshmen have lower percentages than their national counterparts.
- Sixty-five percent of RIC students and 68% of the national group anticipated meeting some portion of their educational expenses through “family resources”. RIC freshmen reported higher percentages of funds from “my own resources” (64% vs. 59%) and “aid which must be repaid” (54% vs. 46%). When comparing the percentages for those personal resources listed as well as those listed for Financial Aid, assistance from “family” and “my own” resources continue to be the greatest resources expected to be available for educational expenses in their first academic year.


- As was true in prior years, RIC freshmen continue to report working more hours in high school and anticipate working more hours in college to meet their educational expenses for the academic year than students in the national group. Forty-nine percent of the RIC freshmen reported working eleven hours or more as a senior in high school compared to 25% of those freshmen in the national group. For RIC freshmen this work history continues into their first year of college. When asked to agree or disagree with the statement "Student estimates chances are very good he or she will get a job to pay for college expenses", 65% of the College's freshmen agreed with the statement compared to 52% of the national freshmen.

REASONS FOR ATTENDING RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE

- Rhode Island College was the first choice for 56% of the freshmen, up from 54% reported in 2009. Thirty-two percent indicated RIC was their second choice.
- Approximately 20% of the freshmen applied only to Rhode Island College. An additional 16% reported applying to one other school, and another 18% reported applying to two other schools. Compared to the national group, about 22% fewer RIC students reported applying to three or more schools, which is consistent with last year's cohort.
- Sixty-six percent of RIC freshmen reported they expect to obtain a Bachelor's degree at Rhode Island College, while an additional 23% plan to earn a Master's degree. Two percent plan to obtain a Ph.D. from the College.



- As in previous years, "Cost of attendance" (65%) and "a very good academic reputation" (52%) were the top two "very important" reasons for choosing Rhode Island College. Some gender differences are particularly noteworthy. At 63% male freshmen continue to view "cost of attendance" as the single most important reason for selecting RIC, with a 25 percentage point difference separating "cost of attendance" from their second most important reason, "academic reputation" (38%). For women "cost of attendance" (66%) and "academic reputation" (58%) were also the top two "very important" reasons. As in past years, a lower percentage of men than women responded "very important" to most of the other major reasons for attending RIC. For example, 21% of men (vs. 39% of women) named "size of college" and 33% of men (vs. 49% of women) cited "graduates get good jobs" as very important reasons. Cost continues to be the single overriding factor for both men and women when choosing to enroll at Rhode Island College.




ACTIVITIES ENGAGED IN DURING LAST YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL

- Seventy-three percent of Rhode Island College freshmen and 76% of freshmen in the national group estimated they spent five hours or less per week studying or doing homework during their senior year in high school. Sixteen percent of both RIC freshman and the national group reported spending less than one hour per week. Sixty-three percent of the RIC freshman versus 67% of the national group reported performing volunteer work.
- Rhode Island College freshmen continue to report a greater level of employment than the national group. Seventy-four percent of the College's freshmen, compared to 49% of the students in the national group, reported working during their last year in high school. Thirty-one percent of the RIC freshmen reported working 16 hours or more hours per week compared to 18% of their national counterparts. In addition 65% of the Rhode Island College freshmen reported they will most likely work to pay for their educational expenses while in college compared to 52% reported by the national group.
- The percent of RIC freshmen who reported they drank beer as high school seniors decreased from 35% in 2009 to 30% in 2010. More men (37%) than women (27%) reported drinking beer in their senior year of high school. The number of RIC students who reported they "drank wine or liquor" also decreased from 43% in 2009 to 39% in 2010. Like RIC freshmen, the students in the national group showed a decline from 2009 to 2010 in the percentage of students who reported drinking beer and drinking wine or liquor.



PROBABLE FIELDS OF STUDY AND CAREER

- The most frequently reported probable fields of study for this year's freshmen are Education (24%), Nursing (19%), Social Sciences (10%), Arts and Humanities (9%), and Business (9%). Interest in Nursing, Social Sciences and Business has remained steady, while interest in Education and Arts and Humanities each decreased by three percentage points. At 9%, the number of freshmen who are undecided as to choice of major decreased by one percentage point this year over last year.



- Probable careers selected by the incoming freshmen mirror their probable fields of study, with teaching, nursing, and business reported by the majority of freshmen. Fourteen percent of the freshmen indicated they are undecided about their choice of career.

ATTITUDES AND VALUES

- RIC freshmen have traditionally been slightly less conservative in political orientation than their national counterparts and this year's freshman class continues to reflect that tradition. Thirteen percent of the College's freshmen characterized themselves as "conservative" or "far right" compared to 16% nationally. Twenty-one percent of RIC freshmen characterized themselves as "liberal" and 3% as "far left" and these percentages are similar to those reported by the national group. The remaining 62% of the freshmen attending Rhode Island College and 53% of the national sample reported they are "middle of the road" in political orientation.
- Attitudes measured where Rhode Island College freshmen differed the most from the national group are as follows: "Gays and lesbians should have the legal right to adopt a child" (89% vs. 76%), "The federal government is not doing enough to control environmental pollution" (83% vs. 82%), "The federal government should raise taxes to reduce the deficit" (26% vs. 31%), "Affirmative action in college admissions should be abolished" (41% vs. 45%), and "Wealthy people should pay a larger share of the taxes than they do now" (69% vs. 70%).

LOCAL QUESTIONS

Freshmen entering the College in the Fall of 2010 were asked a series of locally constructed questions about their experience with Internet-based technology, employment intentions, and participation in student activities. Their responses are as follows:

- Eighty percent of freshmen have either a desktop (23%) or a laptop (57%). For their primary computer, 82% of freshmen use Windows as their operating system.
- Of the 98% of RIC freshmen who reported having a cell phone, 36% of them have either a Blackberry, iPhone, or other smart phone.

- Ninety-three percent of RIC freshmen reported having a Facebook account, with 90% logging in daily or weekly. Forty-five percent are members of a RIC Facebook group.
- About half of the freshmen cited that modern recreational/athletic facilities were “very important” or “important” to them.
- Fifty-five percent responded that a diverse student body was “very important” or “important” to their educational experience at RIC, while 51% responded the same to a diverse faculty.
- Freshmen noted that a campus map (81%) and academic advisement (67%) would be “very” helpful in their transition to RIC. Fifty-four percent reported that social events would also be “very” helpful; while 45% responded that an upper classmen student liaison would be helpful.
- More than two-thirds of the freshmen respondents plan to attend “social” student organization-run events. Women cited this event more than men (76% vs. 64%), while 18% of the men plan to attend intramural events as opposed to 11% of the women.
- Twenty-one percent of RIC freshmen “plan or hope to work on-campus”, 37% “off-campus” and another 36% plan to do both. More than two-thirds of them plan to work 10 or more hours per week while attending RIC. Forty-five percent plan to use their income for tuition and fees, followed closely by personal expenses at 33%.
- Of those respondents who plan to be a residential student in the fall, 34% indicated they would “seldom” or “never” stay on-campus over the weekends.
