

## **ASSESSMENT II**

### **Grades**

The History M.A.T. program builds upon the candidates' undergraduate preparation and requires courses that directly address the NCSS themes. In addition to undergraduate courses, M.A.T. candidates take four required seminars and an independent reading course; the required portfolio contains major paper assignments from each of these courses, aligned with appropriate themes. Students are also required to maintain a 3.0 GPA to remain in good standing in the program. Finally, the Program Director, in consultation with the Graduate Committee, analyzes student transcript and recommends additional content courses to ensure that students have sufficient academic background to meet NCSS standards in the following areas: 1.1.: Culture and Cultural Diversity; 1.2: Time, Continuity and Change; 1.3: People, Places and Environments; 1.4; Individual Development and Identity; 1.5: Individuals, Groups and Institutions; 1.6: Power, Authority and Governance; 1.7: Production, Distribution and Consumption; 1.8: Science, Technology, and Society; 1.9: Global Connections; 1.10: Civic Ideals and Practices.
